

COVENTRY— Members of the Coventry High School drama club will be hosting their spring production this weekend; a play the students said, will "bring everybody together."

Mychael Wilkinson, theatre director, explained that this year the production is titled "Almost, Maine."

This play was written by John Cariani and was featured in Smith and Kraus' "New Playwrights: Best Plays of 2006."

"I wanted to do something with a lot of people, but simple," he added. "I spent my nights looking through shows and found this play and I knew this was the perfect one."

The production includes nine separate plays in one as it focuses on the lives of nine couples in the town of Almost, Maine.

The students playing the 18 lead characters began rehearsing in January and Wilkinson said rehearsing for this play was completely different than previous productions.
