COVENTRY— The second drill competition of the year will be held today at 8:30 a.m. and Coventry's Air Force Junior Reserve Officers' Training Corps (AFJROTC) will be competing at Coventry High School. There will be nearly 10 schools going to the high school to participate in the competition.

To prepare for the competition, Coventry's Drill Team, comprised of 16 JROTC cadets, competed at New Britain High School where they took home trophies in three events: Color Guard, Inspection and

Team Drill Regulations.

Coventry's Drill Team has won several championships in the past and is determined to continue their legacy. The cadets practice three times a week, 12 hours total, to perfect their skills. Each gun weighs roughly 9 pounds, in which they twirl and catch them during each event.

"It is extremely difficult to do what they do," said Dorothy Jackvony, a JROTC

mother.

The coach of the drill team is Melissa Cole, while the inspection is the responsibility of Chase Repose and Danny McBride, the Commander of Team Drill Regulations. McBride also acts as Commander who oversees the entire drill team. Gina Studley has also guided them in their practices and competitions.

"They have helped mold and guided this team into becoming champions,"

Jackvony said.

The AFJROTC Unit was saved from being cut at Coventry High School and has become the first Regional Vocational-Technical Program allowing students in neighboring towns eligible to attend the program.
