The latest Smith Hill Report also covers bills on a millionaires' tax (think funding of your pension), providing some financial assistance to retired teachers and state employees affected by the frozen COLA system, a proposed Rule of 90 that would help prevent teachers from dying at their desks from old age, and a universal school breakfast and lunch program.
